The Group

The SUSU LGBT+ Society group is **secret**. That means only other members can see that you're in it.

Things that you 'like' or post in the group won't show up to anyone outside the group.

Pages you Like

Pages that you've 'liked' are listed on your Facebook profile.

If you're concerned about people knowing about your involvement in SUSU LGBT, then **don't** 'like' our page.

In 2013, researchers showed that Facebook likes can be used to **predict** (among other things) sexuality [1].

Be Considerate

Many of our members are **out and proud**. Others aren't out to everyone and have to actively manage their identity on sites like Facebook to avoid being outed.



Think before you tag people in photos or post things on their timeline. Could the content you've posted result in **awkward questions** for that person?



Timeline Review

You can enable a feature called **Timeline Review** to prevent content that you're tagged in from showing up on your timeline until you've approved it.

Other people can still find the content via search or browsing, but this can help to catch photo or status tags, before they're shown to your gran.



Removing Content

If someone uploads a photo of you, you can ask them or Facebook to remove it.

Use the **Report Photo** option and choose "I'm in this photo and I don't like it"

Don't forget that some **clubs** upload photos to their pages.
